PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2010/2011

For the last two years I have used the word "renaissance" in my report and I am going to use it again. The dictionary definition is "A rebirth: a period of intellectual revival". Well, time will give the verdict on that one! We have certainly tried in these last few years to " up our game" as they say and although we have not attracted too many new members we have gained some but unfortunately lost some as well.

When one uses the term rebirth it does not imply that the organisation was dying on its feet. As this will be my last report as President I believe it is incumbent upon me to review the activities of this Association over the years since I have been President/Chair. I believe I took office about 10 years ago and was on the Committee before that. Much has happened and things have changed – we looked towards the twenty-first century by opening a web site (173 hits this year from Brazil, US, France, Germany & Senegal).

In the good old days of Wansdyke District Council we received a grant each year and as a Councillor I was given the job of seeing that the money was spent as it was intended although those grants stopped many years ago. It was with good stewardship that we have survived financially until now. Here I should thank our Treasurers both Fred and Joan Ellison for their contribution over all those years.

(At this point Julie held up a plaque) This is one of the impressive documents that were handed out in the early years to Councillors involved in the setting up of this Association: Noreen Pope, Doug Miles, Les Sell and many others (including Peter Dando & Non Hobson shown in photo overleaf Ed).

Back in those days it was very much a closed organisation and it was not until 1977 when we were formed that people of Keynsham really got involved with twinning with Libourne. Since then there have been countless exchange visits with our friends in Libourne and many changes of officers both here and in Libourne.

Over the years the Committee have been very active and meetings have been very well attended. Here I should thank in particular Margaret Stone who will be leaving the Committee this year. Thank you Margaret and Bryan for the use of your house during the past years for our meeting. We know that we will have your continued interest in the Association. Thank you too to all members of the Committee and officers who have willing given their time and energy to the Association during this and in past years.

We, of course, had a very successful visit by our friends from Libourne in May and ended the visit by a Dinner at Cameley Lodge. They have invited us back next year (2012) and more of this when we talk about Libourne activities later in the Agenda.

As I leave office I would like to have a look ahead as to where we are headed and in this regard I want to read a brief piece from the internet on European Twinning:

"A twinning is the coming together of two communities seeking, in this way, to take action with a European perspective and with the aim of facing their problems and developing between themselves closer and closer ties of friendship.

It represents a long-term commitment between the partners. It should always be able to survive changes in political leadership and short-term difficulties of one or other partner, and support each other in times of need. Being a commitment for the long term, it is vital to ensure that the partnership is regularly reviewed to make sure it meets the needs of the present day, and remains fresh and dynamic."

Over the years we have tried to uphold these principles and I am sure that your new President will do the same.
